2024 Grand National Open Teams - Sydney Metro Region

The ABF has made major changes to the GNOT to curb the ~\$50K loss it has been making on the event every year. See the ABF's website https://abfevents.com.au/events/gnot/2024/index.asp for full details. In summary, the National Finals will now be held in two stages. The first will be held online from Friday 20 – Sunday 22 September using the RealBridge platform. That stage will qualify 4 open teams and 8 non-metropolitan teams to face-to-face finals in Sydney on 23-24 November. The ABF is also passing on some of their savings – most significantly the entry for teams to the Finals has been reduced to \$300.

There will be some changes at the local level too. Firstly, to accommodate the new National Final structure, the Sydney Metropolitan Regional Final is scheduled for 7 & 8 September. It will be played F2F at the NSWBA. Fraser Rew, who has done such a good job for us as Metro GNOT Organiser, has taken over from Ray Ellaway as National Organiser. David Wiltshire will take over from Fraser as the Metropolitan Organiser. David will be running a one-stop shop. He will be checking MP awards, then collating and forwarding the relevant information to the State Masterpoint Secretary after the Metropolitan Final. An Excel spreadsheet that simplifies the checking process for both clubs and David is now available to help streamline the process. No information is to be sent directly to the ABF Masterpoint Centre or State Masterpoint Secretary. Everything goes to David. Club GNOT events may be played F2F or online on RealBridge. Events run on BBO or StepBridge are not allowed.

NSW has 22 places in the National Finals, 7 of which are assigned to the Sydney Metropolitan Region. The NSWBA has absorbed increasing costs for the last few years, to the point where it was running the GNOT at a loss. Not only has reduction in ABF entry fees for 2024 largely addressed this problem, it has allowed us to slightly reduce the cost to participating clubs rather than raising them. **The GNOT is the only opportunity for players to earn Gold masterpoints in a club session**, so we encourage all clubs to support this event. If entries increase, it may be possible to reduce all Regional Final entry fees further in 2025.

The Metropolitan GNOT Organiser, David Wiltshire, metrognot@nswba.com.au requires;

- (i) The completed Excel coversheet available from the NSWBA website.
- (ii) A complete copy of the results for each session as pdf, text, html, Word or Excel files. For a teams event, this must include a list of all teams and their members and the number of matches won, drawn and lost. For a pairs event, the final score and placing of each pair.
- (iii) Masterpoint information as a .gld file, sent as an email attachment.
- (iv) A complete list of team members (*i.e.* names and ABF numbers) of teams that will proceed to the Metropolitan GNOT Final.

GRAND NATIONAL OPEN TEAMS (GNOT)

Overview of the GNOT

The Grand National Open Teams is an Australia-wide event conducted by the Australian Bridge Federation Inc (ABF). It is the only opportunity for players to earn Gold Masterpoints in their local club. It works like this:

- Australia is divided into regions on a geographical basis.
- Each region provides a set number of teams to the National Final (a total of 64 teams in 2024).
- Clubs hold heats to qualify teams to a final within their region.
- Each Regional Final qualifies 1 or more teams to the National Final.
- From 2024 onwards, the National Final will be played in two stages:
 - 1. a knock-out with Swiss repechage in mid-September played online on RealBridge platform,
 - 2. face-to-face Finals involving 4 open teams and 8 non-metropolitan teams in late November or early December in Sydney.
- The ABF provides travel grants to teams that qualify for the face-to-face Finals in Sydney.

GNOT in NSW

The ABF has appointed the NSWBA as the Organising Body for all GNOT regions in NSW. The ABF has stipulated that NSWBA is to send 22 teams to the National Final - 7 of these will come from the Sydney Metropolitan region, the remaining 15 from elsewhere in NSW.

The NSWBA appoints a Metropolitan GNOT Organiser, a Country GNOT Organiser and a team of Regional Organisers who are responsible for conducting the GNOT in NSW.

All clubs have been assigned to one region only and can qualify teams only to that region's Final. These regions are slightly different to those used for the Country Teams or administrative purposes.

FURTHER DETAIL

Please review these as they contain important information about running the GNOT in your club.

CLUB QUALIFYING EVENTS (CQE)

All clubs in metropolitan Sydney are invited to hold qualifying events (CQEs) to determine representative teams that will compete in the Metropolitan Final.

Clubs may hold one, two or three separate qualifying events, each being 2 - 5 sessions in length. It is recommended that clubs create a separate event in their calendars for their GNOT CQE.

Players may enter in as many different CQEs as they wish, at different clubs within metropolitan Sydney, subject to the rules of the club holding the CQE.

Event formats

CQEs may be in the following formats:

- Teams
- IMP pairs events (Butler or cross IMPs) with teams then formed from eligible pairs.

Regular club matchpoint duplicate sessions are not acceptable for two reasons:

- The GNOT is ultimately a team event (scored by IMPs) so the qualifying events should follow the same scoring approach.
- Clubs should be charging a premium to players in GNOT heats to show they are special (*i.e.* they carry Gold masterpoints) and to allow the club to collect sufficient monies to fund team entry fees to the Metropolitan Final see Financial information section for details.

Qualifying teams to the Metropolitan Final

The number of teams to qualify to the Metropolitan Final from each separate CQE is calculated as follows from the number of tables in play. A maximum of one seventh (fractions rounded up) may qualify and a minimum of one seventh (fractions rounded down) must qualify. This means:

- For heats up to 7 tables, the club must send 1 team to the Metropolitan Final;
- For heats between 8-13 tables, the club must send 1 or 2 teams to the Metropolitan Final;
- For a heat of exactly 14 tables the club must send 2 teams to the Metropolitan Final;
- For heats between 15-20 tables, the club must send 2 or 3 teams to the Metropolitan Final; etc.

A club must send (or pay for) at least one seventh of its CQE field to the Metropolitan Final in order to award Gold masterpoints.

Nominating teams to the Metropolitan Final

Clubs that do not hold a CQE may nominate one (1) team to the Metropolitan Final.

Direct entry of teams to the Metropolitan Final

The NSWBA recognises that there is a wide disparity in the standard of teams entering the club qualifying competitions. It can be much easier to qualify to the Metropolitan Final from some clubs than from others. The NSWBA will therefore accept entries directly into the Metropolitan Final. The cost for direct entry will be \$260 per team and all team members must have previously played in a CQE within the Sydney metropolitan region.

METROPOLITAN FINAL

The Metropolitan Final will qualify three teams to the GNOT National Final. The Metropolitan Final is typically a double knockout with Swiss repechage, but the exact format is dependent on the number of teams playing. The Metropolitan Final is scheduled to be held at the NSWBA on a weekend in early September.

DIRECT QUALIFYING EVENTS (DQE)

The Sydney metropolitan region is unique in NSW in that it contains about half the state's affiliated clubs and the majority of the state's top players. The DQEs provide an opportunity for teams to bypass the Metropolitan Final and qualify directly to the National Final.

The NSWBA DQE (Monday nights, online on RealBridge) qualifies 2 teams directly to the National Final; the North Shore Bridge Club (Thursday nights, online on RealBridge) and the Sydney Bridge Club (face-to-face on a weekend) DQEs each qualify 1 team directly to the National Final. All three events also qualify one seventh of their field to the Metropolitan Final. The DQEs are open to all residents of Sydney and the immediately neighbouring GNOT regions (*viz.*, Central Coast, Mountains and Tablelands-Illawarra).

MASTERPOINTS

In club heats, Gold Masterpoints will be available to the winners of every match at the rate of 0.04 masterpoints per board, *i.e.* winners of a 5 board match will receive 0.20 Gold masterpoints per player, while winners of an 8 board match will receive 0.32 Gold masterpoints per player. CQEs may be held F2F or as online events on RealBridge. Clubs will be invoiced by the NSWBA for their Masterpoint costs. Do not pay anything until you receive the invoice.

In the Metropolitan Final, these awards increase to 0.06 masterpoints per board, *i.e.* winners of a 14 board match (or segment) will receive 0.84 Gold Masterpoints per player. In the case of 5 or 6 person teams, the masterpoint awards per member will be 4/5 and 2/3 respectively. Outright masterpoints will be awarded to the top third of the field. The NSWBA will pay for the Masterpoints awarded at the Metropolitan Final.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION

ABF charges

The ABF makes two charges for the GNOT:

- \$300 per team entered to the National Final
- \$10 per table that enters the event at a qualifying level

The NSWBA has calculated a fee structure that allows clubs to collect sufficient funds to cover further entry fees and masterpoint charges and is consistent across all regions. (Players in the country regions will be paying slightly less.)

Costs to clubs

The NSWBA will be responsible for paying the above fees to the ABF. It will also be responsible for Metropolitan Final running costs. The money will be raised by the following fees:

Clubs should note that they will need to charge a small premium on normal table money for GNOT heats in order to raise sufficient monies for these fees. Clubs will be invoiced by the NSWBA for team entry fees and the masterpoints awarded in their qualifying heats. The NSWBA will then pay the ABFMPC for the masterpoints awarded.

Costs to players

The premium charged to players to raise sufficient funds will depend on the number of tables and sessions in your heat, but typically should not be more than a few dollars a session. The following table gives some examples of how to calculate a reasonable amount for clubs who run small, medium and large CQEs.
