2021 FINALS OF THE STATE OPEN PAIRS CHAMPIONSHIPS & COUNTRY OPEN PAIRS CHAMPIONSHIPS

SUPPLEMENTARY TOURNAMENT REGULATIONS

This competition is conducted under the Laws of Duplicate Bridge 2017, supplemented by the Tournament Regulations of the NSWBA as amended and these Supplementary Regulations. In case of conflict between these Supplementary Regulations and the NSWBA Tournament Regulations, the Supplementary Regulations shall apply.

1. Entry, Eligibility and Fees.

1.1 Every player must be an active member of the Australian Bridge Federation masterpoint system with a home club in NSW or the ACT.

1.2 Entries from affiliated clubs must be sent to Wing Roberts <u>office@nswba.com.au</u> and accompanied by the appropriate Excel and .red masterpoint files as explained in <u>www.nswba.com.au/tourn/state/2021/docs/StateOpenPairs_Regs_2021.pdf</u>. Fees for such pairs (\$100 per pair) will be paid by the affiliated clubs.

1.3 Other pairs may enter directly via the NSWBA's on-line entry system. The entry fee for each such pair is \$120 per pair, payable by the players before commencement of play.

1.4 Country Pairs. To be eligible to qualify for the Country Pairs Final a pair must either (a) have qualified via a non-metropolitan affiliated club, or

(b) each member of the pair must have a main residence in a non-metropolitan region of NSW and/or be a *bona fide* member of and regular player at a non-metropolitan club.

2. The Event

2.1 The event will be held online using the RealBridge platform. It is a requirement that all players have working video and audio connections. Players may only turn off their camera with the permission of the Director.

2.2 Entrants will be seeded into separate NS and EW fields of equal strength and containing equal numbers of country pairs. The qualifying stage will consist of two sessions, each of 24-28 boards, on Saturday beginning at 10.00am. If this results in an incomplete movement (or revenge rounds), initial seating will be made so that all pairs play against fields of similar strength.

2.3 Each board will be scored using standard duplicate matchpoint scoring. Session scores will be tabulated as percentages.

2.4 The top 7 pairs in each field will be offered places in the State Open Pairs Final. Any position not filled will be offered to the highest scoring available pair from the same field.

2.5 The top 7 country pairs in each field will be offered places in the Country Open Pairs Final. Any position not filled will be offered to the highest scoring available country pair from the same field. Should fewer than 7 pairs from either field accept offers to play in the Country Pairs Final, offers will be made to the highest available pairs in the other field. The size of the Country Final will be reduced if fewer than 14 eligible pairs are available.

2.6 Country pairs may decline a spot in the Open Final in favour of one in the Country Final. Only pairs in the Country Open Pairs Final are eligible to win the Country Open Pairs Championship.

2.7 A separate Country Pairs Final will not be held if fewer than 12 pairs qualify for it. In such a case, the top placed country pair in the State Open Pairs Final will be declared the Country Pairs Champions. They are entitled to winners' medallions, but no prize money.

2.8 Ties for the last qualifying position in each final will be broken by the standard NSWBA tie-breaking procedures.

2.9 Players who fail to qualify for either the State or Country Pairs Finals are entitled to free entry to the NSWBA Swiss Pairs Congress on the Sunday.

2.10 Each final will be a 7 table Howell with standard duplicate matchpoint scoring, playing 4 boards against every other pair.

2.11 The official scores are those on the NSWBA website, not those displayed by Realbridge.

3. Substitutions

3.1 Pairs are allowed one substitution for one session of the Saturday Qualifying. A substitute for a Country Pair must be a *bona fide* member of a non-metropolitan club for the pair to remain eligible to qualify for the Country Pairs Final and title.

3.2 All substitutions must be made in accordance with the NSWBA Tournament Regulations, submitted via the on-line substitution form at <u>http://www.nswba.com.au/forms/substitute.asp</u> and must be approved in advance by the NSWBA Events Committee. In cases of emergency, where this procedure is not possible, the Director is empowered to rule on any proposed substitution.

3.3 No substitutions are permitted in the Finals on the Sunday.

4. Systems

4.1 No Yellow systems will be permitted.

4.2 Pairs may not claim protected pair status.

5. Score Correction Period

- 5.1 The correction period for both qualifying sessions ends at 9.00pm that night.
- 5.2 The correction period for both Finals ends at 12.00 midday on Monday 22nd November.

6. Prizes

6.1 Ties will not be broken - titles and prize moneys will be shared.
